ACTIVE YOUNG LEADERS

The Explorers clocked up an extraordinary **503 Nights Away** this year, nearly nine each, including Winter Camp, District Camp, Intercamp, and an Indoor Camp at Néihäischen with the Brussels Explorers. With FNEL space available only six times this year, a heartfelt thank you to **Les Aigles, Les Lions Blue and HoGa** for hosting us. Alongside first aid, cooking, pioneering, navigating and knife & axe handling, the unit picked up new skills too, including Lacrosse, crafting and bike maintenance, and gave back by running Telstar Got Talent, performing in the Fakelzuch, teaching the Scouts Touch Rugby and guiding Swedish scouts around the city.

Mérite Jeunesse – Duke of Edinburgh Award (led by Nicola Laurent and Clare Dunn): 21 Telstar Explorers received their awards **from members of the Grand-Ducal family** in March: four Gold, two Silver and 15 Bronze, plus four more via school. Expeditions reached North-East Luxembourg (Bronze) and the Vosges (Silver), with the Gold expedition heading to **Slovenia in mid-July**. Beyond Mérite, three Explorers earned their **Diamond Awards**, and two former Explorers are working towards their King's Scout Award with Margret as mentor. A refreshed Explorer programme launches in autumn 2026.

Young Leaders Scheme (led by Clare Dunn and Lynn Frank): a full YL Camp saw 17 Explorers finish their training, with 19 active Young Leaders in all, and for the first time Explorers supported Beavers, Cubs and Scouts in the same year, with four older Explorers serving as YLs with the Scout sections.

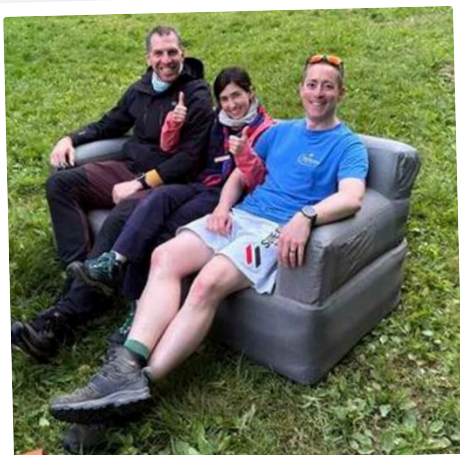
Save the date: World Scout Jamboree fundraising

Finances
